

RALLYING TO THE CAUSE

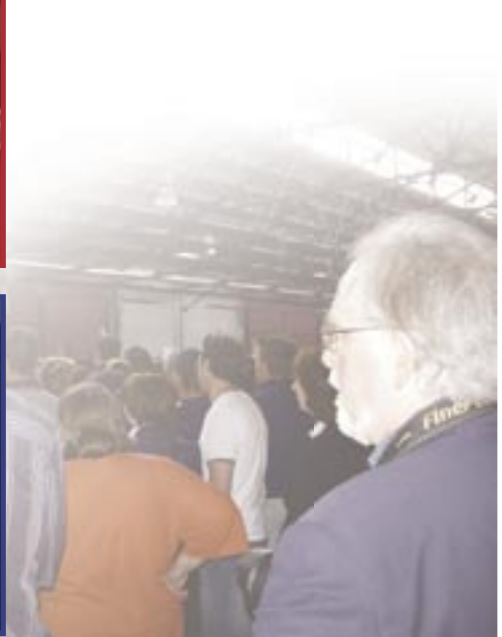
In November workers around Australia rallied against the new industrial relations legislation.

SPREADING THE WORD

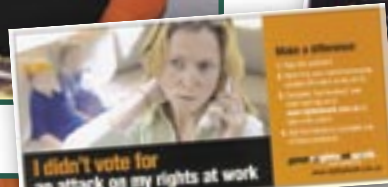
Your SDA representatives continue to be active in the battle being waged against the proposed industrial relations reforms.
